Brumbaugh Legislation Featured in *USA Today* and *Education Weekly*

BROKEN ARROW - Landmark legislation by local State Rep. David Brumbaugh continues to draw nationwide attention. House Bill 1989 was signed into law by Oklahoma Governor Mary Fallin in 2013 and has since become benchmark legislation for other states who seek to create similar protections against the sharing of students' data.

Brumbaugh sponsored the legislation after many began expressing concerns about Common Core standards and the potential for data sharing to take place unbeknownst to parents and students. **Brumbaugh has been one of the Legislature's foremost opponents of Common Core.**

His proposals puts into place safeguards which on both the collection and transfer of student data. Both *USA Today* and *Education Weekly* have brought attention to Brumbaugh's efforts as they have expanded from Oklahoma and into other states.

Oklahoma Port Task Force Meets

OKLAHOMA CITY - The Oklahoma Port Task Force recently met to discuss the strategic plan for Oklahoma waterways. The group's agenda includes addressing waterway/maritime recommendations, the WRRDA bill, and a proposed report to the Governor.

The Governor created the task force at the request of Broken Arrow State Representative David Brumbaugh.

"If we do not address the over \$100 million of differed maintenance needs at our Oklahoma port, and the depth levels for barge transportation, we could see crisis to our state's economy with an estimated \$2 million a day impact. In 5 years we are looking at a 50% chance of failure if something isn't done. The ports of Catoosa and Muskogee had two record setting years in 2013 with 2 to 7 million tons of cargo shipped and 4,000 people employed," Brumbaugh explained.

"Crude oil, agriculture products and steel are shipped through the ports providing vital economic growth the Oklahoma," he added.
