BRUMBAUGH WINS STATE HIGHWAY DESIGNATION FOR BROKEN ARROW

BROKEN ARROW - State Representative David Brumbaugh R-Broken Arrow, with the assistance of the Oklahoma Department of Transportation, the Oklahoma Turnpike Authority and the Indian Nation Council of Governments, has won a state highway designation for Broken Arrow on the Creek and Muskogee Turnpikes.

Brumbaugh supported the effort on behalf of both Broken Arrow and the entire region.

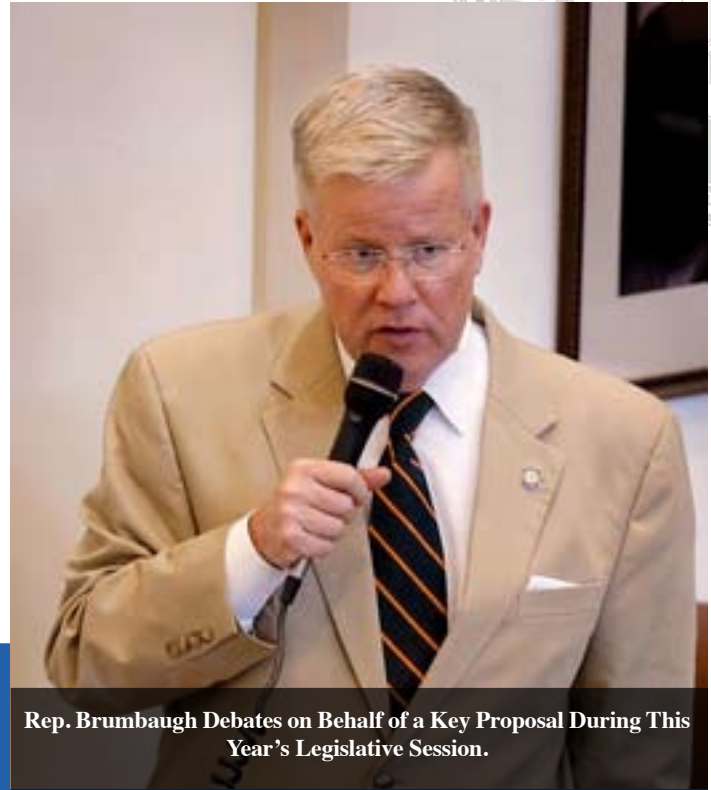
Rep From Broken Arrow Selected to Attend Energy Conference in Nation's Capital

Brumbaugh Testing Proposal a "Hit"

BROKEN ARROW - State Rep David Brumbaugh R-Broken Arrow was recently featured on The Oklahoma News Report following his highly successful legislative hearing on the need for innovation and reform of education testing in Oklahoma's public schools.

The study focused on providing Oklahoma with "norm based" testing for students to include both "on-line and paper and pencil options".

"There have been too many failures with the State Department of Education and its vendors," said Brumbaugh. "Students should test twice year: at the beginning and end of the year to make sure our kids are learning. This would allow for more instructional time in the class room and less anxiety. It will also help raise scores for our students and our schools."

Brumbaugh's proposal has received supportive feedback from parents, teachers, administrators and board members.
